- Leadership as a **Peer-Assisted-Learning facilitator**
- Leadership as a **University “New Student Orientation” Leader**

Applicants must also be willing to meet the following programmatic expectations:

- Weekly in-person meetings during Spring 2024 semester (days/times TBD, depending on participant schedules and availability)
- Completion of assigned readings prior to group meetings
- Completion of Responsible Conduct of Research training
- Intermediate deliverables tied to compensation
- Submission of final project proposal (determined jointly by participant and supervising faculty) by May 2023
- Presentation of project poster in May 2023.

Those successfully completing the HLP Scholars experience will receive hourly compensation up to a maximum of \$2700 for their work.
