### Mission of the CHPPR Community Advisory Council

The **Center for Health Practice, Policy, and Research (CHPPR)** at California State University, Sacramento is the vision of a group of administrators and faculty from the College of Health and Human Services (HHS). The CHPPR is dedicated to impacting community health by promoting collaboration, interprofessional practice, and innovation to reduce health inequities in California's capital region. The purpose of the Center is to create both a virtual and physical space for key stakeholders to collaboratively improve the quality of life of community members residing in the greater Sacramento area.

The CHPPR retains a Community Advisory Council. The Council meets biannually with one meeting occurring in the fall semester and one in the spring semester. The Council's mission statement is as follows:

*The Community Advisory Council to the **Center for Health Practice, Policy, and Research** at California State University, Sacramento is made up of a group of community stakeholders dedicated to impacting community health by promoting collaboration, interprofessional practice, and innovation to reduce health inequities in California's capital region. The Council meets biannually to collaboratively share and discuss information related to current issues, trends, and developments in health and human services. The mission of the Council is to provide input and assistance to the CHPPR as it seeks to fulfill its mission, including issues related to resource development, external relations, and strategic planning.*

The Council functions through a system of five cohort groups, each with a liaison. The cohorts are charged with conducting a caucus prior to the meetings so that an equally-distributed agenda can be created that defines the needs of the group and brings current issues from the field to the direct attention of our leadership and stakeholders. CHPPR keeps minutes of each meeting on file. These minutes, and the information they contain, provide meaningful guidance that assists the CHPPR's planning and decision making as it evolves, grows, considers new initiatives, and remains focused on contemporary community issues.
