Audiology: Overview

- Healthcare profession
- Scope of practice (ASHA, 2018)
 - Assessment of hearing, balance, and other related disorders, including tinnitus and auditory processing, across the lifespan
 - Comprehensive audiologic (re)habilitation services for individuals and their families across the lifespan who are experiencing hearing, balance, or other related disorders
 - Early hearing detection and intervention for infants and young children
 - Educational audiology
 - Hearing conservation and preservation
 - Telehealth
 - Counseling

- Hearing conservation programs




Job Outlook

- Median annual salary was \$77,600 in May 2019(bls.gov)
- Job outlook: Employment expected to grow 16% from 2018 to 2028(bls.gov)
- Typically, 40-50 hours/week; part-time work
- Other professions: SLP, medicine, allied health, education



Education Requirements to Become an Audiologist

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- Doctor of Audiology (Au.D.) degree
 - Replaced the Master's as the clinical entry-level degree
 - Clinical doctorate
 - NOT a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.)
 - Focus is on clinical proficiency
- Licensure upon graduation from an Au.D. program





Doctor of Audiology (Au.D.)

- Typically, four-year degree
- Coursework: anatomy and physiology, psychoacoustics, signals and acoustics, amplification, vestibular assessment and evaluation, aural rehabilitation, professional issues, pediatric and educational audiology
- Clinical practica and completion of a full-time externship during final year of program
- Research project
- Comprehensive exams



- Resume
- Letters of recommendation
- Application fees
- Interview

 - ACAE: Developing Status
 - CAA: Pending

The Au.D. at Sac State

*Subject to change

- The Au.D. program at CSUS is designed to prepare students for a career as audiologists through a contemporary evidence-based curriculum and diverse set of clinical experiences. Students graduating from the program will be clinically competent, knowledgeable of the field, and involved with the profession.
- Four years of full-time enrollment (11 semesters, including summers)
- Four major components:
 - 1. Didactic coursework
 - 2. Clinical on- and off-campus clinical practica
 - 3. Doctoral research project
 - 4. Comprehensive exams



Pre-requisites

In addition to an undergraduate degree from an accredited institution, students must also have completed a course in each of the following:

Domestic and International Students

*Subject to change

- Domestic applicants with foreign documents and international students (F-1 or J-1 visa applicants) must consult the Office of Graduate Studies and Global Education/International Admissions Department for specific application instructions.
 - These students must also submit TOEFL scores.
- The CSAD department-specific TOEFL scores are:
 - Paper-based: 560
 - Computer-based: 220
 - Internet-based: 100



Academic Records

- Overall and major GPA: 3.0 or higher
- GRE scores obtained within the last five years
 - Minimum combined score of 291 on the verbal and quantitative portions, and minimum of 3.5 on the writing portion
 - Take the GRE early



GRE in Spring 2020

- ETS is temporarily offering an at-home option for the GRE
- "COVID-19 will not impact when your scores are reported. At the end of your test, you will be able to see your unofficial scores at the test center for Verbal Reasoning and Quantitative Reasoning. Your official scores, inclusive of your Analytical Writing score, will be available in your ETS Account about 10-15 days after your test date."-ETS.org



Letters of Recommendation

*Subject to change

- Three letters of recommendation <u>must</u> include:
 - Two from university faculty who can speak to the student's academic potential
 - One from a professional reference in the field of audiology
- Ask early



CV/Resume

- Education
 - Dates of attendance
- Related work, volunteer and multicultural experience
- Scholarships, awards or other commendations



Observation Hours

- Documentation of 25 completed observation hours in communication sciences and disorders, of which at least 50% must be in audiology.
- All hours must be documented using the form available on the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders' website.

Statement of Purpose

*Subject to change

- Applicants are required to submit a written personal statement discussing their motivation for pursuing the Au.D. and how it relates to their future career goals.
- Essays should also include:
 - 1. Career goals
 - 2. Areas of interest
 - 3. Reasons for applying to CSUS
 - 4. Experiences with culturally and linguistically diverse groups
 - 5. Other personal, clinical, or academic experiences related to audiology



Written Essay

- Applicants are required to submit a written in response to the question:
 - How have your background, work/volunteer experiences, and experiences with culturally and linguistically diverse populations prepared you for a career as an audiologist?



Step 1: CalStateApply Application

- Apply through the Graduate Studies website for CSUS
- The personal statement will be submitted through CSDCAS.
 In the personal statement category, type "Essay submitted directly to department."
- Select "Doctor of Audiology" as the "Degree Objective."
- One set of official transcripts from <u>all</u> colleges and universities attended (including CSUS) should be sent to the Office of Graduate Studies at CSUS (even though the Graduate Studies website indicates that two sets of transcripts are needed). Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended should also be submitted to CSDCAS.



Step 2: CSDCAS Application

- Be prepared to submit transcripts through CSDCAS
- Portal opens October 1, 2019
- Portal closes February 15, 2020, at midnight Eastern Time (NOTE: This is 9:00pm in California)
 - Extended: June 15, 2020
- Call Student Customer Service with questions: 617-612-2030 M-F, 9-5pm ET
- It is the applicant's responsibility to follow all CSDCAS instructions and meet deadlines.



Financial Aid

- \$7371/semester
- It is recommended that students complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov
 - FAFSA can be submitted starting on October 1, 2019, for the Fall 2020 semester
 - The 2020/21 FAFSA will need to be completed for Fall 2020, Spring 2021, and Summer 2021 aid
- Four types of aid:
 - Grant funding
 - Direct unsubsidized loan
 - Direct Graduate PLUS loan (credit-based)
 - Private loans

- Financial Aid will also present at the New Student Orientation for admitted students in August 2020
