CCC-SLP. She is also SLP discipline director for the Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental Disabilities (LEND) program at MIND.

Her line of research is focused in the areas of developmental speech and language disorders. She has a specific interest in examining speech and language outcomes in children with cleft palate and developmental syndromes of Ras/MAPK pathway dysregulation. She has published in the area of neurofibromatosis and has coauthored publications in the areas of specific language impairment/ADHD and pediatric feeding. She has received many University grants as well as funding from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR). She is on the advisory board for District 2 of the California Speech Hearing Association and is part of the Response Evaluation in Neurofibromatosis and Schwannomatosis (REiNS) International collaboration.
