


Criminal Justice majors are assigned a faculty advisor at the time they are approved for admission into the major. Majors must meet with their assigned faculty advisor during their first semester. Advising appointments are scheduled online through the EAB. Visit the CRJ website.

Students should consult other University publications and the Academic Advising Center (LSN-1013) to determine their catalog rights and to learn of all the graduation requirements which in addition to the work needed to complete an academic major in Criminal Justice.

## Required Lower Division (LD) Courses (12 units)

Criminal Justice is currently a Pre-major program. See CRJ website (www.csus.edu/hhs/cj) for current Pre-major and eligibility information.

To be considered for acceptance into the Criminal Justice major, students must complete the following four courses with a grade of "C" or better, have completed a minimum of 45 units, have an overall GPA of 2.5 or higher, and submit the online Eligibility Form as soon as all requirements are completed.

## Required Upper-Division (UD) Courses (24 units)

Students must achieve a "C-" grade or better in each upper-division course applied to the major and a GPA of at least 2.0 ("C") in all upper-division required courses. Please note: CRJ 101, 102, 121, 123, 130, 141, and 160 are considered pre-requisites to enrolling into CRJ 190. Students must have those courses completed and/or in progress when they enroll into CRJ 190.

Students will collaborate with their Criminal Justice advisor to develop a plan of electives that reflects the student's academic and professional interests. The Writing Intensive graduation requirement may be completed in the major. An approved minor may be substituted for up to 12 units of the major elective courses and fulfills the requirement for selection of a course from the "Supporting Courses."
