Expressed Interest Status

All Criminal Justice (Transfers) admitted to Sacramento State are admitted as ***“expressed interest CRJ”***

Timely Declaration of Major (University Policy):

- Undeclared upper division transfer and returning students, including those with an Expressed Interest, are required to submit a declaration of major form prior to registration for their second semester; failure to do so will result in a registration hold

Application Eligibility Criteria

- Eligibility Criteria must be met/completed for application to be considered.
 - Overall GPA of 2.6 or higher (includes all college level courses)
 - Completion of 45 units
 - Completion of the following Criminal Justice courses with a grade of “C” or better:
 - CRJ 1: Introduction to Criminal Justice
 - CRJ 2: Law of Crimes
 - CRJ 4: General Investigative Techniques
 - CRJ 5: The Community and the Justice System

Associate Degree for Transfer

Application Eligibility Criteria

- Eligibility Criteria must be met/completed for application to be considered.
 - Overall GPA of 2.6 or higher (includes all college level courses)
 - **A bump of .1 will be given if needed**
 - Completion of 45 units
 - **May be in progress**
 - Completion of the following Criminal Justice courses with a grade of “C” or better:
 - CRJ 1: Introduction to Criminal Justice
 - CRJ 2: Law of Crimes
 - **May be in progress**



Division of Criminal Justice

Major Requirements

- 60 units are required for the Major
 - 12 units lower division courses
 - 24 units of upper division “Core” requirements
 - 24 units of upper division Electives

Students will collaborate with their academic advisor to develop a plan of electives that reflects the student's academic and professional interests. Electives must be drawn from at least three of the listed "Areas of Interest," of which one must be from the "Supporting Courses" area. The University Advanced Study graduation requirement may be completed in the major or as part of the GE pattern. An approved minor may be substituted for up to 12 units of the major elective courses and fulfills the requirement for selection of a course from the "Supporting Courses."
