Traditional BSN Program – Two Phases

- Health Science(2 years)
- Clinical Nursing (2 years)

Admission as a Health Science student does not guarantee admission to the "clinical" nursing program.



Candidates

- Sac State
- Community College
- Second Bachelor

Continuing Sac State students, transfer students and second baccalaureate degree candidates are given equal consideration in the admission process.



Prerequisite Requirements

- University Admission
- California Residency (DACA, AB 540, Military Fee Waiver exception)
- Eight prerequisite courses
- Four corequisite courses (strongly recommend completion before admission, not required)
- Minimum Nursing GPA of 3.3 (on the prerequisite and corequisite courses completed at the time of application) *average GPA 3.995
- ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) (with a minimum score of 75.0%) *average TEAS score 91%
- Minimum of 60 points to apply
- Supplemental Nursing Application
- BSN Non-Refundable Evaluation Fee \$35



Prerequisite Courses

- 1. Oral Communication (any GE Area A1 course)
- 2. Written Communication (any GE Area A2 course)
- Critical Thinking (any GE Area A3 course)
- 4. Statistics
- 5. Chemistry (lab optional)
- 6. Anatomy or A&P I (Online or Virtual lab ok)
- 7. Physiology or A&P II (Online or Virtual lab ok)
- 8. Microbiology (Online or Virtual lab ok)



Corequisite Courses

- 1. Introductory Psychology
- 2. Nutrition
- 3. "Life Span" Human Development (Must have Birth to Death Component)
- 4. Societal-Cultural patterns course



Prerequisite & Corequisite Courses . . .

- AP and IB Examination credit is acceptable.
- A grade of C- or better is required.
- Plus and minus grades are not considered (e.g. a C- or C+ is considered a C).
- Acceptable courses may be taken at any accredited college.
- California community college articulation agreements may be found at <u>www.assist.org</u>.



Repeat Policy

- Only 3 of the 12 prerequisite and corequisite grades may be repeats.
- Only 1 of the 3 repeats may be a science course (Anatomy or A&P I, Physiology or A&P II, Chemistry, and Microbiology).
- A third attempt will not be considered may use first or second attempt.
- Courses over 7 years old on the first day of instruction are acceptable, but not included in repeat count.



Repeat Policy, Cont.

- Repeats are evaluated based on content; not course numbers.
- Any course which satisfies a content area is considered an attempt.
- If you repeat a course, but you use your first attempt, it is not considered a repeat.
- Withdrawals (W/WU grades) are not considered repeats.
- We recommend you seek advisement from each program you are considering—policies vary!



Selection Criteria

- Selection is based on the rank ordering of admission points earned:
 - 40 "Adjusted" Nursing GPA
 - 30 TEAS test
 - 18 Optional Criteria points
 - 88 points maximum
 - 60 points min to apply
- No random computer selection.
- No waiting lists; must reapply if not selected.



"Adjusted" Nursing GPA

- Maximum 40 points.
- Under the conditions outlined below, candidates may omit up to two courses from their Adjusted Nursing GPA.
- The Adjusted Nursing GPA must include at least 2 science grades.
- Candidates with 10-12 grades may omit 2 grades from their Adjusted Nursing GPA.
- Candidates with 9 grades, may omit 1 grade from their Adjusted Nursing GPA.
- Candidates with 8 or few grades, may not omit any grades.
- AP examination credit is considered a grade (no units/grade points).
- In-progress courses are not considered omissions.



TEAS - ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills

- Maximum 30 points.
- Basic college aptitude assessment.
- Similar to ACT or SAT.
- Multiple choice one correct answer.
- Four content areas math, English, reading & science.
- A minimum score of 75% is required to be considered for admission.
- The test may be taken three times within a five-year period preceding the Supplemental Nursing Application deadline.
- The highest score will be used.



TEAS, Cont.

- For TEAS test taken at a non-Sac State location, results must be purchased from ATI and submitted by ATI directly to the School of Nursing.
- The TEAS Study Manual and practice assessments are available for purchase through the ATI website.
- The manual may be available at the Sac State bookstore; or some local libraries.
- ATI TEAS® Secrets Study Guide



Optional Criteria

- Maximum 18 points.
- Bilingual Language Proficiency (3)
- Health Related Work Experience (1-3)
 - **50 = 1**
 - **75 = 2**
 - -100 + = 3
- Environmental (4)
- First Generation College Student (4)
- No Courses Omitted from Nursing GPA (2)
- No Repeated Course in Nursing GPA (2)



Impaction

Fall 2021

408 applicants

78 enrolled, 22 declined, 19 ineligible, 57 qualified alternates, 262 outside selected/alternate range

Statistics for 78 enrolled students:

- Point cut off 71 (maximum 88 points possible)
- Average Nursing GPA 3.934 (range 3.676 4.0)
- Average "Adjusted" Nursing GPA 3.999 (3.962 4.0)
- Average TEAS test score 92.37% (range 86.7% 97.3%)
- Average points earned for Optional Criteria 13
- Average Total Points earned 75 (Highest points 86)
