












Physical Therapist Centralized Application Service (PTCAS) Data: National Applicant Trends

 17,517 unique applicants submitted 77,273 applications to an average of 4.41 programs/applicant








National Data Applicant Trends

Sacramento State Department of Physical Therapy

- Accept 34 students every Fall Semester
- Program is 9 semesters in length
- There are 3 full-time clinical experiences, 12 weeks each
- Students participate in multiple community clinics (mentored practice) during their coursework which include:
 - Ortho available for students, faculty, staff and community members
 - Neuro available to patients with stroke or other neurological conditions
 - STEPS pediatric clinic for children with neuromotor impairments





Applying to Sacramento State

- Admission Requirements
 - Bachelor's Degree prior to matriculation
 - 10 Prerequisite courses
 - Graduate Record Examination (GRE)
 - Observation Hours (volunteer/work) hours: ≥50
 - Letters of Recommendation: 3
 - Interview

 Virtual labs accepted for required classes taken during the years 2020, 2021 and 2022



How to Apply

Step 1: Prepare to Apply

- Review Admission Requirements listed on our webpage and on PTCAS to verify you have met all minimum requirements
- Make sure you are on track to complete your prerequisite coursework
- Complete your volunteer/work hours by October 1 deadline
- Identify who will be willing to write your letters of recommendation
- Schedule to take the GRE before the deadline

Step 2: Apply

 Submit complete PTCAS application at <u>www.ptcas.org</u> by the deadline.



What does a complete application look like?

- Prerequisites are completed by the required deadline with a minimum 3.00 GPA.
- DPT Prerequisite Supplemental Worksheet completed and submitted with PTCAS application.
- GRE exam taken by application deadline and within the last 5 years

- Volunteer/work hours completed and verified in PTCAS by deadline date.
- All letters of recommendation received in PTCAS by deadline date.
- Official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended sent to PTCAS.
- PTCAS application submitted by October deadline.

- Human Anatomy w/lab (4 units)
- Human Physiology w/lab (4 units)
- General Psychology (3 units)
- Additional Psychology (3 units)
- Statistics (3 units)
- General Chemistry I & II w/lab (8-10 units)
- Physics I & II w/lab (8 units)
- Exercise Physiology (3 units)



Prerequisite Requirements

- Minimum prerequisite GPA of 3.00 or higher.
- Prerequisite courses must be completed at an accredited college or university with a minimum grade of "C" or better.
 Course grades of "C-" or lower are not accepted.
- Applicants may have up to 4 pending prerequisite courses when submitting their application. At least 2 of pending courses must be completed by the end of fall term, and the remaining 2 courses to be completed the following spring term.
- Anatomy, Physiology, and Exercise Physiology courses must have been completed within the past 10 years.



Prerequisite Repeat Policy

- Grades from any and all courses taken to fulfill each prerequisite will be considered in calculating your GPA.
- If a course was taken twice (2), only the higher course grade will be used.
- If a course is taken three (3) times, all three (3) grades will be averaged.
- If a course was taken four (4) times to complete one required prerequisite, application will be disqualified.
- A course is considered a "repeat" even if it is taken at a different university, or has a different course number.

DPT Supplemental Prerequisite Worksheet

All applicants must submit the DPT Supplemental Prerequisite Worksheet with their PTCAS application. This worksheet can be found on our website at www.csus.edu/college/health-human-services/physical-therapy/prerequisite-worksheet.html and must be uploaded to your PTCAS application by the deadline.

Applicants will submit the following information for each course:

- Name of institution where course was taken
- Course number and title
- Semester or quarter units
- Semester and year course was taken
- Number of units and grade
- In-progress or planned status for pending courses

Applications missing this document will be considered incomplete and will not be reviewed.



Graduate Record Examination - GRE

- GRE results taken within last five years are sent directly to PTCAS using GRE code 7588.
- The last date to take the GRE is ~October 1, 2025
- A minimum 3.5 or higher for the Analytical Writing component and 29th percentile (150*) or higher for the Quantitative Reasoning GRE component are recommended to be competitive in the admissions rankings
- Highest component scores from multiple test dates will be used ("superscoring")

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Observation Hours*

Applicants must complete and verify on PTCAS a minimum 50 total hours of volunteer/work experience. All hours must be under direct supervision of a licensed physical therapist. Hours that have not been completed and verified by the application deadline will not count towards the 50 required hours minimum, and your application will be disqualified.

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*Beginning with the 2025-26 application cycle, both inpatient and outpatient will be required, with a minimum of 16 hours in each setting

Letters of Recommendation

Applicants must arrange to have three letters of recommendation sent to PTCAS. All three letters must be received by the deadline date.

- Two (2)letters from a licensed physical therapist you have volunteered or worked with.
- One from a college professor you have taken a course from.

How to strengthen your application



- Applicants can earn additional admission points if they qualify for the following:
 - Advanced Upper Division Coursework
 - Background Characteristics
 - GRE scores above the threshold scores (qGRE ≥29th percentile; aGRE 3.5 or higher)



Advanced Upper Division Coursework

Applicants that have completed upper division advanced coursework may be eligible for additional admission points. A maximum of four courses may be submitted for consideration. However, only one course may be submitted from each of the following categories. All Advanced coursework must have a grade of "B-" or higher, and "A" grades earn more points than "B" grades.

- Advanced Human Anatomy
- Neuroanatomy
- Neurophysiology
- Advanced Biomechanics
- Advanced Exercise Physiology or Cardiac
- General Microbiology
- Motor Learning
- Therapeutic Exercise





Background Characteristics

Additional admissions points are available for:

- Second Language Competency
 - Proficiency
 - Fluency
- Disadvantaged Economic Background
- Disadvantaged Educational Background
- Disadvantaged Environmental Background



Interviews

- In mid-December the top 130 qualified applicants will be invited to apply to Cal State Apply (\$70), and schedule an interview.
- A typical interview day consists of
 - Meeting current DPT students
 - Each applicant interviews with a 3-person Panel: 1 faculty member + 2 clinicians
 - Tour of DPT facilities
- Interviews are usually scheduled in late January.

Common Mistakes to Avoid

- GRE scores never received by PTCAS, not in time
- Less than 50 observations hours were verified and completed by deadline.
- Not all required letters of recommendation were received, or the letters were received were not from the type of correct evaluator.
- Prerequisite GPA less than 3.00.
- Overall GPA less than 3.00.
- Too many outstanding prerequisites.
- Not all college transcripts were sent to PTCAS

For the 2024-2025 cycle, 395 applications were received; 74 applicants disqualified so far.

Sac State Selection Process

- All application materials are reviewed to determine if they meet minimum requirements.
- Complete applications are then ranked according to:
 - Strength of Academic Record (Prerequisite GPA)
 - Professional References
 - Background Characteristics
 - Advanced Coursework.
- Once ranked, top 130 are invited for an interview.
- After interviews, the interviewees are rank ordered.
- Top 34 are offered seats, remaining applicants placed on wait list
- Applicants are notified of their initial status within 1 week of final interviews.
