Health Promotion, Policy and Leadership

Overview

The Master of Public Health (MPH) in Health Promotion, Policy and Leadership provides advanced training to address the health needs of diverse communities. Students will learn how to enhance their practical skills for implementation of health policies, programs and promotional tools to reduce health risks and protect populations.

The MPH program is offered in a cohort-based, hybrid class format, providing working professionals the flexibility to complete the degree in two years. As public health practitioners, students will prepare for leadership positions across promotion and policy in the public, private and government sectors.



Benefits

- Flexible hybrid schedule, with evening classes to accommodate the working professional.
- Learn to serve local populations through a social justice lens.
- Self-guided practicum requirement that helps students explore new areas of practice.
- Sacramento location allows for insight on policy-making in California.



Audience

- Ideal for those advancing or transitioning to a career in Public Health leadership.
- A health-related background is not necessary to pursue this degree—however, two or more years of full-time professional work experience in public health (or related field) is preferred.



Structure

- Hybrid: 50% of coursework completed online and 50% of coursework in-person.
- Three intensive residencies required throughout the program.
- Practicum and capstone project requirements complement professional experience.

Admission Requirements

To be considered for admission, applicants must have completed a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university, with a minimum GPA of 3.0 from the last undergraduate or graduate degree completed.

Admitted students who do not have a bachelor's degree in public health from a CEPH accredited program are required to take a non-credit, online training module before starting classes, with a passing score of 80% or higher, in order to prepare them for the program content.

The GRE is not a requirement.
