Occupational Safety and Health (OSH), a concentration in the Bachelor of Science in Public Health, prepares students to protect workers, the public, and the environment by studying factors that affect health and safety. Students learn to assess risk, manage workplace hazards, prevent injuries, investigate incidents, and address health and safety issues in workplaces and communities.
