Advising Outline Supplement Recreation Therapy

Students in the Recreation Therapy option are required to take 18 units of related/supportive coursework (RSC) in human service courses. The following is a list of suggested courses to meet these requirements. The list is not meant to be exhaustive; there may be other courses in which can be used. All RSC must be selected in consultation with a RT academic advisor. Unless otherwise indicated, the following are three-unit courses.

The courses must include 3 units of Abnormal Psychology, 3 units of Anatomy and Physiology and 3 units of Human Growth and Development. The Human Growth and Development course must be across the lifespan (from birth to death). The remaining semester hours of coursework must be fulfilled in the content area of 'human service' as defined by NCTRC.

Note: Prerequisites are listed in parentheses. Departments reserve the right to allow students into non-General Education courses at their discretion.
