What is CSU STEM VISTA's Role at Sac State?

Our CSU STEM VISTA's first goal is supporting the expansion of the College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics (NSM) Advising Center, from serving students from a single discipline to supporting first and second year students from each of our six disciplines. The second goal is to facilitate the integration of our Advising Center and the Center for Science and Math Success (CSMS). Our VISTA is working in the CSMS to expand the marketing materials for programs housed in the center, analyze and present data on existing programs, and present workshops for students and faculty. The VISTA will further conduct surveys and/or focus groups with students to identify their individual needs. Additionally, our VISTA is working with the newly expanded NSM Advising Center to develop advising toolkits, collaborate with faculty chairs, and work to develop a better understanding of how students enter and navigate NSM's degree pathways.

Who is Your VISTA?

Serving at Sac State this year is recent graduate Nick Fortna. Nick recently finished his degree in Biological Sciences at Sacramento State and is pursuing a career in the medical field. Nick has previously worked for several of the CSMS programs, including Peer Assisted Learning and Commit to Study. We are very fortunate to have someone with Nick's background and experience serving as our first year VISTA.

What is Americorps CSU STEM VISTA?

VISTA stands for Volunteers in Service to America and is part of the federal Americorps program. The goal of CSU STEM VISTA is to "eliminate race, class and gender disparities in STEM undergraduate degree programs." The CSU STEM VISTA program currently supports 19 volunteers serving at 12 CSU campuses. Volunteers work over the course of one year to build capacity in programs that focus on student success. Particularly, VISTAs support campus efforts to serve students from lowincome communities, students of color, and first-generation college students. VISTAs work to deliver sustainable solutions that will last beyond the four-year presence of the CSU STEM VISTA program on campus.
