# **SEE Program Frequently Asked Questions**

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#### 1. What Is SEE?

SEE stands for the Science Educational Equity Program. SEE is an academic support program housed in the Center for Science and Math Success that provides a community, advising, peer mentoring and resources to students from underrepresented background in the math and sciences who want to go on into health, research, teaching or STEM workforce.

### 2. How do I apply?

Interested students will need to complete an online application which consist of background and contact information and written responses. You can click here to apply. You can save and pick up your progress later if you need to. You will have two weeks to submit your application once it has been started.

### 3. What are the requirements to join SEE?

Being a student from underrepresented backgrounds who face a barrier(s) in their education and in pursuit of advance degrees or workforce. Students must be someone who wants to increase diversity and inclusiveness in the health, research, teaching and STEM workforce and giving back to their community.

# 4. What majors are accepted into the program?

Students who are majoring in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Geology, Geography and Mathematics. We do accept students who are non-science majors if they are interested in entering a health field other than nursing and will help in fulfilling our mission and goals of SEE.

### 5. Do I have to attend an orientation?

There is no orientation to attend prior to joining but will be required to meet with a SEE Ambassador to do your welcome and intake into the program if accepted.

# 6. Do I need a specific GPA to join?

No specific GPA is required to join

## 7. When is the application due?

Applications will be accepted on a rolling admission each semester. Once the application has been started you will have two weeks to complete.

## 8. If I am accepted what would be required of me?

New students will need to meet with a SEE Ambassador once accepted. You will then be required to meet with a SEE Advisor at least once per academic year, participate in at least 4 activities each academic year (2 per semester) and be active on the SEE Canvas page.

## 9. Do I need to meet with a SEE Ambassador (Peer Mentor)?

All new students accepted into the program will be required to meet with a SEE Ambassador at least 2 times per semester for their first year in the program. Students who are in a pre-major will be required to meet with an Ambassador every until they have entered the major.

## 10. Do I need to reapply to SEE each year?

No, you only need to apply once. Students who have not been active for more than a year might be required to reapply.
