	 3 years of the same language in high school fulfills the FL requirement (e.g. Japanese 1-3). Transfer students need to send high school transcripts to Sac State. The second semester of a language fulfills the FL requirement, so students need to plan for 1 year of a language if they are fulfilling the requirement at Sac State or community college. Students can test out of the FL requirement, but they should schedule a test ASAP.
