COURSE DESCRIPTION:	ECON 198. Tutoring in Economics. Supervised tutorials at educational institutions including Sacramento State where and when appropriate arrangements can be made. Prior approval for tutoring must be obtained from the Economics Department. Emphasis is on the development of effectiveness in the teaching of economics. Graded: Credit / No Credit. Units: 1.0 - 3.0.
LEARNING OBJECTIVES:	 Gain experience explaining economic concepts to students in introductory courses. To develop oral communication skills. To improve comprehension of course materials, and recognize gaps in understanding when explaining concepts to others. To model problem solving, critical thinking, and learning strategies to other students taking economics courses. To develop a deeper understanding of economics through reviewing material from introductory courses, after completing upper division coursework.
GRADING:	Students are graded on a credit/no credit basis. To receive credit, the student volunteer must regularly be available to Economics 1A and 1B students on a drop-in basis during assigned hours.
