Lastly, we address the creative and alternative means Asian Americans have used to promote and advance more accurate portrayals and representations of Asian Americans. Students create their own forms of media and art to accurately represent Asian Americans. Media portrayals devalue lives, produce harmful stereotypes, and contribute to anti-Asian violence.
