# BS Degree in Nutrition & Food (NUFD) 54 Units

Prepares students for careers in the field of nutrition, food management, community nutrition, and food sustainability. The program emphasizes the role of nutrition and food in individual and family health, cultural and behavior influences on food selection, and the management of commercial and noncommercial food systems.

## **Concentration in Dietetics (DPD) 82 Units**

The optional concentration in Dietetics meets requirements that prepare students to become a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN), as well as a variety of careers in clinical nutrition, community nutrition, private practice, food service administration, and food science.

Students interested in becoming a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN) must declare the Dietetics concentration and complete additional science and dietetics coursework.

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# Minor in NUFD 21 units

The minor can complement many majors such as Health Science, Public Health, Kinesiology, Nursing, Child Development, Recreation, Parks & Tourism, Psychology, Gerontology, Family Studies & Human Development.

## Certificate in Grocery Management 15 units

The certificate focuses on food safety, grocery procurement and merchandising, human health and well-being, and marketing/human resource management.

# Master of Science in Nutrition & Food 30 units

The program includes specialized coursework in nutrition science, advanced community nutrition, behavioral nutrition, and food and nutrition policy plus a wide array of interdisciplinary electives.

Designed for career advancement in food access and nutrition education agencies (MS) and to complement Sacramento State's DI for those on the path to become Registered Dietitian Nutritionists (MS+DI).

# **Dietetic Internship (DI)**

This is a post-baccalaureate, 42 week internship that currently accepts 10 students annually. The program provides supervised practice at a variety of healthcare and community facilities with emphasis on disease prevention and public policy.
