



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## Broad Description of FY 21/22 SSIS General Fund Budget



### **Better than Budget Cuts**

- This year's partial OE restoration only brought us up to 85% of FY 19/20 allocation.
- Most of the restoration will be used to refill staff positions left vacant by the hiring chill. Ultimately, our OE allocation will only be  $\sim 11\%$  more FY 21/22 than in FY 20/21.



### **Projected Increases in Spending**

- Expenses are projected to be up in FY 21/22:
  - Travel support fully restored
    - Faculty Council September 1
  - Recruitment 12 positions approved
  - Equipment (e.g., copy machines/printers)
  - Events
  - Office Supplies
  - New Faculty Start-Up & Relocation



## "DFW" Rates in SSIS AY 2020-2021

- **12%** DFW rate (Univ rate = 11.5%)
- 50 courses from 10 different programs have DFW rates >= 15%
- Disparities in URM/non-white/mixed ethnicities, Pell Eligible, First-Gen, Male, and International student groups

**Enrollment – what are FTES?** 


Full Time Equivalent Student (FTES) Student whose class schedule totals 15 units/term for undergraduates\*

3 students with differing units: 6 + 12 + 18 units = 36 units/15 = 2.4 FTES+

\*12 units/semester for graduatestudents+based on 3 unit class

## Hornet Launch 2020-21

- Students enrolled in between
   12-15 productive units in their first year
- Fall 2020 First Time First Year: 4905
- Fall 2021 First Time First Year: 4815
- No Hornet Launch Spring 2022
- Hornet Launch Fall 2022
- Approximately 2300 students enrolled in required Ethnic Studies courses (GE Area F)
