This special **Membership Edition of The Recorder** explains the process for signing up for the upcoming Fall 2023— Spring 2024 Academic Year.

Renaissance Society will send a Constant Contact email message on **Thursday**, **June 1**, with a link to our Registration site inviting you to either renew your membership or to join us for the first time for the upcoming 2023-2024 academic year. ALL Renaissance members will receive a printed June Recorder newsletter in the mail.

# Membership for the 2023-2024 Academic Year is \$100.00 per person.

There are two ways to **Renew or Sign-up** for a Membership:

- 1) **Online** with a credit card payment or
- 2) **By Check** using the form on the next page of this Membership Edition of the Recorder and mailing it in with a check.

Registering online is the fastest, most efficient method and saves us administrative costs. The Paper version is available if your online access is limited. The paper form can also be found on the Renaissance Society website, under "Membership" which can be printed, filled in, and mailed in with your check starting on June 1, 2023.

Note: If you will be 90 years old before July 1, 2023, you are eligible to become an Honorary Member and you will no longer be required to pay membership dues. Do not register online. Instead contact the office at (916) 758-5133 to be processed and registered for the new year. Also, members who **already are Honorary Members** must also register with the office: (916) 758-5133 or email renaissa@csus.edu

### The online internet process is simple and safe.

- Click on the "Online Registration" box, then
- Returning Members click on "Sign Me In" or "Help me Login"
- New Members click on "Sign Me Up"
- The system will ask for credit card information to make your payment but it does not retain credit card information once the transaction is completed

It's simple and in a flash you are up-to-date with your Renaissance Society membership for the Fall 2023 Spring 2024 Academic Year. Do not complete the online registration information more than one time because your credit card will be charged each time. # *In Memoriam* David Warren

Our beloved member David Warren left us on April 12, resting peacefully in his bed at home. He has donated his body to UC Davis.

David's knowledge, teaching, tour leading, friendship, and love endeared him to thousands of Renaissance Society members since he joined in 2003. He initially led seminars with his beloved wife Lois and then taught solo from 2013 to 2022 after she passed in 2013.

Four Renaissance members sum up his life of devoted friendship, service, teaching, and compassion:

"Clarence and I welcomed the happy newlyweds, David and Lois Warren, as our next door neighbors in 1971. We knew them as close friends and neighbors and regularly shared meals, visited each other, attended neighborhood meetings, and welcomed other new neighbors. During the pandemic, our neighbors kept in contact by meeting almost daily. David, especially, looked forward to these gatherings which eventually convened in his driveway. He was extremely knowledgeable and a great conversationalist with a good sense of humor. May he rest in peace." *Clarence & Callie Smith* 

"I was a longtime colleague of David's during his tenure at Sacramento City College from 1969 to 1993where he served as Chair of the Humanities Department. David always attempted to motivate his students to reach beyond their experiences and worlds with integrity and caring. His life was continuously in balance and a powerful presence. After I joined Renaissance Society in 2014, I became a student of his, too. I relished the stimulation and joy which David provided to Renaissance members just as he had to his college students. I have always felt privileged and extremely grateful for our years of close friendship, both as a colleague and then as a lifelong learning student." #### Financial Help Available to Members in Need By Debbie Martinez

The Renaissance Society Board has made a commitment to keep dues at \$100 per year, despite inflation and rising costs. While this is great news, we also know that there are those who could benefit from Renaissance membership, but it would be financially difficult for them to join. Renaissance has a member scholarship program to address that dilemma. We encourage current and prospective members who have financial hardship and a commitment to lifelong learning, to apply for the scholarship.

The Member Scholarship Program waives annual and mid-year membership dues as well as UTAPS parking permits, if needed, for a limited number of applicants for the current academic year. Qualified members can apply each year that they have an identified need. Payments will be internal accounting transfers. No cash will be disbursed directly to individuals. There will not be any retroactive reimbursements for previous semesters. The Board is committed to removing membership barriers that keep new and existing members from joining due to their financial hardship.

To apply, please complete a Member Scholarship Application including a 500-word or less narrative explaining in detail the applicant's need for a scholarship.
