President's Corner

This Renaissance Society (RS) 2020-2021 academic year was an amazing success! RS departed the Sac State physical classrooms and "pivoted" to the Zoom virtual classroom. More than 1800 registered RS members enrolled in nearly 28,000

offerings in 247 programs. Program enrollment quadrupled and programs increased by 60 offerings or 32% from the previous year. Over 300 talented RS volunteers stepped-up to make this reinvention a seamless transition.

When RS started the "pivot," we had no clear vision of the RS programs and services in the virtual world. Mirroring Sac State, Renaissance volunteers were literally building the plane as we took off the ground. As the annual 2020-2021 RS budget was developed, the RS Board of Directors thoughtfully created a \$20,000 "innovation fund" to support this evolving transformation process. Our Finance and Admin Committee projects an end of year deficit of approximately \$27,000. Fortunately, over the years, the RS Board built up a financial reserve allowing RS to deal with the unexpected pandemic curveball.

The RS Board is currently engaged in the annual 2021-2022 budget development process. With membership down 21% from a 35-year record high of 2,325 members in 2019-2020, we anticipate a potential projected smaller deficit again this year. We do not want to increase annual membership dues. Likewise, we do not want to continue tapping into the financial reserves. Again, this year we are offering members the option to make a voluntary donation of "something extra" when you register for RS membership. If you have the wherewithal to donate, please consider joining me in supporting our General Fund.

This allows RS to assist our peers who are living on a fixed income who might be faced with nonrenewal of their memberships if we need to implement dues increases to balance the budget.

One of the unexpected pandemic bonuses was the removal of barriers to RS participation. Our doors swung open widely rather than closed. RS now has almost 100 members or 5% of our membership that live outside the greater Sacramento commuting area who connect virtually with Zoom. RS has members in 17 states and 76 California cities. One member lives in Paris, France (not Paris, Texas).

Please invite your friends, wherever they live, to join RS for the 2021-2022 academic year. Consider giving the Gift of Membership to your friends and family. The RS CCE membership portal is scheduled to open June 1, 2021. Historically, new members hear about RS through word-of-mouth from existing RS members. Please spread the word and share the Renaissance lifelong learning opportunity with others!

Fall 2021 catalog development is well underway with a myriad of interesting programs. RS is closely coordinating with Sac State leadership on the campus reentry plan. Due to social distancing protocols, classrooms will be at 20% to 35% of capacity. Classroom seating top priority is Sac State students paying over \$20,000 per year for their education. Currently we anticipate being on Zoom in the Fall. Rest assured, President Nelsen and his staff want RS to return to campus as much as we want to return.

Thank you again to all of you who volunteer and participate to help support one another as we learn, connect and share. Please be safe and stay masked, social distanced, and well, in mind, body, and spirit!

This special Membership Renewal edition of *The Recorder* will explain and help you process your membership renewal for the Fall 2021-Spring 2022 Academic Year.

Two Membership Options: Online or Paper

- 1. Online, with credit card payments.
- 2. The traditional paper way, mailing an application and check to the Renaissance Office.

You will find directions for using the internet to renew your membership with a credit card below. Or you can renew your membership using the enclosed paper form on Page 3 and mail it in with a check made payable to The Renaissance Society. The paper form also will be available on the Renaissance Society website where it can be printed, filled in, and mailed in with a check.


Membership for the 2021-22 Academic Year is \$100.00 per person.

Note: Parking permits are not currently for sale. Before we return to classes on campus, instructions on purchasing a permit will be sent to all members.

ONLINE CREDIT CARD PROCESS

Important: You need to know your Renaissance Society membership number, which you can look up online with your name and zip code. Also, if you will be 90 years old before July 1, 2021 you are eligible to become an Honorary Member. See below for details.

The online internet process is simple and safe. To access it, you will go to the Renaissance Society website at **www.csus.edu/org/rensoc**. A link will take you to the online system and walk you through the process. The system will be asking for credit card information to make your payment but does not retain credit card information once the transaction completes.



It's simple and in a flash you are up to date with your Renaissance Society membership for the Fall 2021 - Spring 2022 Academic Year. *Do not complete the online registration information more than one time because your credit card will be charged each time.* If you think that your payment did not go through, phone the Renaissance Office at (916) 758-5133.



NOTE: If you will be 90 years old before July 1, 2021, you are eligible to become an *Honorary Member* and you will no longer be required to pay membership dues. **Do not register on line. You must contact the office at (916) 758-5133 in order to be processed and registered for the new year.



Renaissance Society Member Scholarship

Program Finances should not be a barrier to lifelong learning. In 2019 the Renaissance Society (RS) Board of Directors approved a Member Scholarship Program. The program provides current and prospective members of our community, who demonstrate a financial need and a commitment to lifelong learning, the opportunity to participate. The member scholarship program waives annual and mid-year membership dues as well as UTAPS parking permits, if needed, for a limited number of applicants for the current academic year.

Qualified members can apply each year that they have an identified need. Payments will be internal accounting transfers. No cash will be disbursed directly to individuals. There will not be any retroactive reimbursements for previous semesters. The Board is committed to removing membership barriers that keep new and existing members from joining due to their socioeconomic status.

Interested parties will complete a <u>Member Scholar-ship Application</u> including a 500-word or less narrative explaining in detail the applicant's need for a scholarship. Email <u>renaissa@csus.edu</u> or phone (916) 758-5133 to request an application.

Applications will be reviewed for completeness and meeting the need criteria.

Your Dues Are a Huge Part of Our Success



When the Pandemic shut down Sac State last Spring, the members of the Society, especially the Program Committee, planned and executed an extraordinary pivot to online Seminars and other programs. A key concern was how many of our members would return for the 2020-21 program year. We anticipated that our membership would be 75% of what it had been and built the budget with an eye to that reduced membership. A long-term staff member was laid off and most Committee budgets were significantly reduced. However, the Board also created an Innovation Fund to encourage experimentation and create new ways of operating. Even with this cautious approach, a deficit of over \$20,000 was anticipated.

However, you came back and, because of the generosity of many members who contributed more than the \$100 for membership, our Revenues were more than we had anticipated. Although there is still a deficit, the reserve that Renaissance had allowed it to remain stable.

Renaissance will continue its careful approach to the next year. Because we may not be able to return to campus before the Spring, we anticipate our membership will not grow. We will continue with a limited budget. Even so, we will continue to deliver a high quality and exciting program that offers more options than members have ever had.

We look forward to returning to the campus as soon as possible. When we do, it will be because our members have supported the Society and demonstrate their confidence in our ability to provide one of the best senior learning programs in the country.
