This is my last President's Corner Recorder article as Renaissance Society (RS) Board President. I want to thank all of you for your support over the last two years. The time of the "pandemic pivot" truly defined a new era of innovation and continuous improvement for our 35-year-old lifelong learning organization. Over three hundred volunteers helped RS to not only survive, but to thrive in a time of massive disruption. The Renaissance Society 2021-2022 academic year was an amazing success! Almost 1700 RS members registered for over 21,700 enrollments in 214 programs.

This June edition focuses on our Annual Membership renewal and a return to campus for the Fall 2022 semester. The RS on-campus **Summer Program** will feature eight outstanding speakers starting June 3 through July 29 from 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. each Friday. Presentations will be followed by "brown bag" lunches and tours of the Planetarium, the Arboretum, and other "Sac State gems." This is a great chance to carpool and invite friends and associates to experience the joys of lifelong learning and social interaction.

The **membership portal opens online on June 1, 2022**. You can also complete and mail the enclosed membership application with a check to our RS office. You will be able to apply for your UTAPS (University Transportation And Parking Services) virtual parking permit online or stop by the Welcome Center inside the Sac State main entrance at 6000 J Street to complete the registration process starting on July 1, 2022.

Over half of our Fall programs are on Zoom-Monday through Thursday. On Fridays, the other half of our programs will be in-person on the Sac State campus. Several program leaders are offering Friday HyFlex simultaneous in-person and Zoom presentations. So, **no matter where you live, beyond the greater Sacramento area, outside California or overseas,** if you have a computer with a microphone, a camera, and Internet access you can participate in programs face-to-face online. RS has members in 21 states plus the District of Columbia and 63 California cities!

The Renaissance Society is still one of the best kept secrets. Please share the secret with your friends and invite them to join us and become lifelong learners. No grades, no attendance – learning just for the fun of it! We have over 100 Fall programs scheduled. The **Fall 2022 Catalog** will be posted to our RS website on Monday, August 1. **Program registration opens** Monday, August 8.

The Fall 2022 Orientation & Rendezvous working group is planning a return to the Sac State University Union Ballrooms for in-person sessions on Friday, August 12. The Orientation will be in Ballroom III from 9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. in HyFlex – simultaneous presentation in-person and Zoom. Next, a guided Sac State tour from 10:45 to 11:15 a.m. will orient Renaissance newcomers and returnees on how to navigate the campus. Following an early lunch, the traditional Rendezvous will be held in Ballrooms I & II from 12:00 to 1:30 p.m. You will have the chance to meet RS program leaders and explore volunteer opportunities to support Sac State students and serve on RS committees.

Thank you again to all of you who volunteer and participate to help support one another as we **Learn, Connect, and Share**. See you this Summer and Fall on the Sac State campus!

#### There are two ways to <u>Renew or Sign-up</u> for a Membership:

- 1) Online, with a credit card payment

The paper form is also available on our Renaissance Society website where it can be printed, filled in, and mailed in with your check <u>starting</u> on June 1, 2022. Look for the paper form under the "Membership" option on the front page of the Renaissance website.

<u>Important</u>: If you are renewing your membership, you will need to know your Renaissance Society membership number, which you can look up online with your Last Name and Zip Code <u>HERE</u>. Also, if you will be 90 years old before July 1, 2022, you are eligible to be an *Honorary Member*. See details below.

The online internet process is simple and safe. To access it, go to the Renaissance Society website at **www.csus.edu/org/rensoc**. First click on the **"Online Registration"** box. <u>Returning</u> members, please click on **"Sign Me In"** or **"Help me Login."** For <u>new</u> members, click on **"Sign Me Up."** The system will be asking for credit card information to make your payment, but does not retain credit card information once the transaction is completed.

It's simple and in a flash you are up-to-date with your Renaissance Society membership for the Fall 2022-Spring 2023 Academic Year. *Do not complete the online registration information more than one time because your credit card will be charged each time.* If you think that your payment did not go through, phone the Renaissance Office at (916) 758-5133 or email <u>renaissa@csus.edu</u>.

**Note**: Instructions for purchasing parking permits are available at <u>https://tinyurl.com/RSparking</u>. Parking Permits cost \$40 and will be good from July 1, 2022—June 30, 2023. You can <u>purchase</u> your parking permit for the new fiscal year starting on <u>July 1, 2022</u>. Click <u>HERE</u> to get to the UTAPS online parking portal.

\*\*Note: If you will be 90 years old before July 1, 2022, you are eligible to become an *Honorary Member* and you will no longer be required to pay membership dues. <u>Do not register online</u>. You must contact the office at (916) 758-5133 in order to be processed and registered for the new year.

**Thank you** to our Members who have answered our call to reduce printing costs and paper use over this past year! Thanks to your cooperation, printing costs for the Recorder newsletter dropped from \$7,500 a year to just over \$2,000 a year. Keep it up!

We now have less than 15% of our membership requesting print copies of the **Recorder**, 15% requesting the printed **Membership Directory**, and 23% requesting the printed **Schedule-at-a-Glance**.

The Board of Directors continues to urge our members to read our publications online. Not only will it have a significant financial impact, but it will help the environment by saving paper and related products

needed to print and mail publications.\*

> **RENAISSANCE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR FUTURE MEMBERS** By Debbie Martinez

(Woo-Hoo!!)

Finances should not be a barrier to lifelong learning. The Renaissance Society has a member scholarship program to meet that need. We encourage current and prospective members who have a financial hardship and a commitment to lifelong learning to apply for the scholarship.

The member scholarship program waives annual and midyear membership dues, as well as UTAPS parking permits, if needed, for a limited number of applicants for the current academic year. Qualified members can apply each year that they have an identified need. Payments will be internal accounting transfers. No cash will be disbursed directly to individuals. There will not be any retroactive reimbursements for previous semesters. The Board is committed to removing membership barriers that keep new and existing members from joining due to financial hardship.

To apply, please complete a **Member Scholarship Application** and include a 500-word or less narrative explaining in detail the applicant's need for a scholarship. You can find a PDF of the application on our website **starting on June 1, 2022** for fall applications, under the "**Membership**" option on the front page of our Renaissance website. You can also request one from the office at <u>renaissa@csus.edu</u> or call (916) 758-5133.

#### RENAISSANCE SOCIETY 2022 SUMMER PROGRAM **PARKING INFORMATION** By Deborah Seiler

Our Summer 2022 Program is free and open to the public, but there may be minor parking fees for some. Here's the arrangement:

#### **Renaissance Members who had a parking pass for** the Spring 2022 Semester

You're in luck. Your parking pass is valid until June 30, 2022. After you renew your membership, beginning June 1, you will be able to purchase a new \$40 parking pass beginning on July 1. This parking permit is valid until June 30, 2023.

## All Others

You will need to pay either \$4 for two hours or \$7 for the day during our Fridays in June. If you join or renew when membership opens on June 1, you will be able to purchase a new \$40 parking pass starting



on July 1. This parking permit is valid until June 30, 2023. If you do not purchase a parking pass, you will need to pay the \$4 or \$7 fee.

#### **Closest Parking Structures to Del Norte Hall**

Parking Structure 2 (PS2) has a permit machine that accepts \$1 or \$5 bills or Visa and MasterCard credit cards. It is on Level 3 near the elevator closest to Subway.

Parking Structure 5 (PS5) has permit machines that also accept cash or credit cards. The machines are on Levels 3 and 4 next to the elevator.

#### Easy Options

Go to the UTAPS office inside the Welcome Center just off State University Drive. The Welcome Center is well marked and there is free 30-minute parking while you pick up a parking permit using cash, check, or credit card. This allows you to park in ANY lot or structure on campus.

If you use this option, you can park in Parking LOT 2 for the Summer Program which is right next to Del Norte Hall.

And, if you have a handicap permit, the parking permit plus your handicap placard allows you to park in all the designated spaces.

#### You can also pay by phone:

Sign up for a PayByPhone account and download the app. When you arrive on campus, enter location number "5115" into the app to pay your parking fee.
