Anne Putt Has Spent Her Life in Central California

Born in Stockton, Anne has ventured as far north as Yuba City. A graduate of Hiram Johnson High School in Sacramento, she enrolled at Sac State, and then earned a B.S. in dietetics at U.C. Davis in 1975. Because the job market was tight, she worked in retail for a few years before earning an MBA from Sac State.

Initially, Anne was employed by a small consulting firm, before returning to Sac State to earn an MS in Accounting. She felt the initial MBA was very general and she wanted to focus on something more specific. Anne had observed her Stockton grandparents struggling financially, and wanted a more secure career. For three years, she taught accounting at Sacramento City College.

Following her daughter's birth, Anne opted to stay at home for a few years. She volunteered with the PTA, took some classes, and assisted her husband Allen Putt, who taught at Sac State, with grading papers.



By 1993, Anne had decided that she needed to earn some serious money. She earned a CPA license, and began 15 years with the State of California. She worked with several agencies, the longest being Caltrans.

Their daughter, whose liver was failing, moved back home with her parents. In 2013, she passed away in Birmingham, Alabama, while waiting for a liver transplant.

Dementia took her husband Allen in 2021. And her mother, Beverly Spencer, also a Renaissance member, passed away at age 98 on July 12, 2025.

Anne is currently writing a book on the topic of transforming suffering into happiness.

Last year she served as assistant controller for the Renaissance Society and enjoyed volunteering with Sac State students who are earning their PhDs in Physical Therapy. She assisted with setting up this year's Open House, describing all of the Renaissance members as "so open and inviting."

As a widow, Anne enjoys the company of her two Yorkies and gardening in the East Sacramento bungalow she and her husband purchased many years ago.

THE PROGRAM COMMITTEE HEARS YOU

At the recent Orientation and Open House, the Program Committee conducted a survey of those in attendance. We wanted to know how to best offer programs to our membership. We promised those who completed the survey that we would report on the results.

What we heard

- 80% indicated a very strong preference for in person classes over Zoom when they had to choose their preference.
- 75% were willing to attend Saturday programs
- 66% were willing to attend evening classes or events
- 98% were willing to pay extra for a special program
- 50% of those were willing to pay \$25 to \$50 extra
- 13 indicated they were interested in becoming a program leader

Areas of Interest

Preferred topics were:

50% Music and Performing Arts

33% want more Arts and Crafts

80% want Current Events and Politics

80% want Science and Technology

70% want History

More information:

- Those with mobility issues identified difficulty with being on campus. Transportation and parking were listed as problems.
- When asked about Zoom classes, they identified technology as a major problem both their own skill level and those of the Program Leader
- They liked the convenience of Zoom classes
- Most choose to attend the Zoom class live rather than watch the recording. However, they like having the recording for when they had to miss class.
- Most thought that in person classes were more informative and participants enjoyed dialogue with the Leader and with other participants

The Program Committee thanks everyone for their input. As we go forward this information will be, and is, very helpful. We especially want to thank Sandy Britton for all her work in developing and scoring the surveys. Her help made it all happen!

Smartphone-Enabled Walking Tour of Sacramento, As Seen through the Eyes and Paintbrush of Artist Anthony Montanino

The buildings and parks of Sacramento were visual inspiration for Anthony Montanino. His paintings, known for their bold colors and strong use of light and shadow, decorate the walls of public spaces and private collectors' homes throughout the area.


Now many of his pieces are available for anyone to view, right where he first sketched them out. Thanks to a free smartphone map, you can take a self-guided tour, from McKinley Park through the Victorian and Craftsman streets of midtown Sacramento, past the State Capitol, the waterfront, and Old Ironsides, to Broadway's Tower Theatre, viewing images of more than 60 Montanino paintings as you go.

Just find a Montanino on the Map postcard at a local gallery. Point your smartphone's camera at the card's QR code (or point your web browser to bit.ly/4nHdj7r) to see a map of downtown Sacramento with picture-frame icons. Tap on one for a pop-up window with the painting of that location. The map will give you walking or driving directions that will take you to view the building or scene in the painting. When you're ready to move along, simply tap another picture frame nearby on the map to continue your tour. Your travels will take you through midtown Sacramento's shady streets, past parks, corner groceries, and dining establishments that were among Anthony's favorite subjects. Enjoy Sacramento from the artist's perspective.
