Sociology Major information:

Students do not need to follow any of the areas of concentration. They can take 17 units from any area. Students can only use 3 units of 195, 198 or 199 for major requirements. They can use as many as they want toward the 120 total graduation units.

Soc 101 is a pre-requisite for Soc 102. Need to make sure enrolled in Soc 101 the semester prior to last semester at Sacramento State.

Balance Core/Required Major courses throughout each semester, so not taking more than 2 in a given semester.

Make sure apply to graduate as soon as complete 85 units.

Transfer information:

- Most lower division classes will transfer for Sociology major, but lower division classes cannot substitute for upper division requirements.
- Four year University transfers: transfer as many classes/units as university accepts.
 - Still have to complete residence requirement (30 units)
 - Can request substitution for Upper Division Sociology classes taken at another university

General Education/Grad Requirements information:
