


The Region's University, Today and Always






DEGREES EARNED





- The Anchor University Grants Program allocated \$103,877 to support 16 staff, faculty, and student community partnership projects.
- Sac State met and exceeded state requirements to address period poverty, installing 145 free menstrual product dispensers in 33 buildings.
- Sac State's Out of the Darkness campus walk was recognized as one
 of the Top 10 Fundraising Walks by the American Foundation for
 Suicide Prevention.
- The Wellness, Education, Leisure, and Lifestyle (WELL) expansion project received an Outstanding Facility Award from the National Intramural and Recreational Sports Association (NIRSA).





- In just 36 hours on Give Sac State Day, 1,181 people donated nearly \$319,000 to student-centered programs.
- The Associated Students Food Pantry's 30 volunteers provided food and basic necessities to 8,700 students.
- Bioretention planters, porous pavement, and bioswales filter 2.9 million gallons of stormwater annually, keeping pollutants from flowing into the American River.
- Sacramento State is ranked No. 5 Best Nursing School in California by RN Careers, with a 97.75% National Council Licensure Examination passing rate.





- The College of Business has been AACSB-accredited since 1963, one of just 5% of the world's 16,000 higher education institutions to have earned this designation (Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business).
- The Construction Management program has seen a 100% employment rate for its graduates 12 years running.
- Sac State is the first and only California State University campus to offer a paramedic program. Students consistently rank higher than national averages when taking the National Registry Exam.





- The College of Health and Human Services works with 1,100-plus community partners, offers 8 community clinics, and places **2,000-plus interns** in clinical and field positions each year.
- The Doctor of Education (Ed.D) in Educational Leadership is ranked **No. 10 in the nation** (Best Accredited Colleges).
- Sacramento State's student-run history journal "Clio," was awarded first place in the 2022 Nash History Journal Prize national competition.
- More than 1,000 visitors viewed the first deep space images from NASA's James Webb Telescope at the Sac State Planetarium.





- The Center for Counseling and Diagnostic Services (CCDS) Counselorsin-Training master's students provided services to approximately
 600 people through its Practicum and Internship program.
- The College of Arts and Letters' signature events, U-CREATE at the VERGE Cultural Center, U-Nite! at the Crocker Art Museum, and Sunday Funday during Festival of the Arts, connected Sac State with more than 1,500 members of the community in 2022.
- The Full Circle Project celebrated 10 years of helping first-year Asian Pacific Islander Desi American (APIDA) students navigate college, increasing their four-year graduation rate from 5% in 2012 to 24% in 2022.
