#### Barrio Art in Communities

The Department of Art has secured a grant to partner for the second time with Washington Elementary, expanding the impact of the ART 148 Barrio Art in Communities program. The project brings art and learning opportunities to K-12 students and parents while providing CSUS students with community service opportunities.

The Art 148 course, reintroduced in Spring 2021, has seen increased enrollment, growing from 14 to 25 students by Spring 2023. Shifting to the Fall semester as part of a program modification, the course is expected to reach full capacity with a focus on service learning, anti-racist teaching methods, Dia de Los Muertos programming, and well-being workshops.

The objectives include exploring anti-racist teaching methods, developing culturally relevant lessons, gaining community service and teaching experience, accumulating pre-credential hours, and challenging pre-conceived notions about communities. This initiative underscores a commitment to positive impact, cultural understanding, and community engagement through art education.
