The Department of English has received a grant to collaborate with Florin High School and 916 Ink, advancing anti-racism in Sacramento K-12 education through antiracist writing pedagogy and ensuring the sustainability of the Writing Program. This project aims to achieve two primary objectives: firstly, to enhance experiential learning opportunities for Sacramento State students, making it an integral and self-sustaining aspect of the Writing Program at both undergraduate and graduate levels, and secondly, to contribute to the greater Sacramento region through service-learning opportunities that embody antiracist writing principles.

By fostering linguistic justice at Florin High School and emphasizing community engagement and experiential learning, the Writing Program aims to equip CSUS students with the knowledge and skills essential for their field, promoting increased engagement, motivation, and preparation for the workforce.
