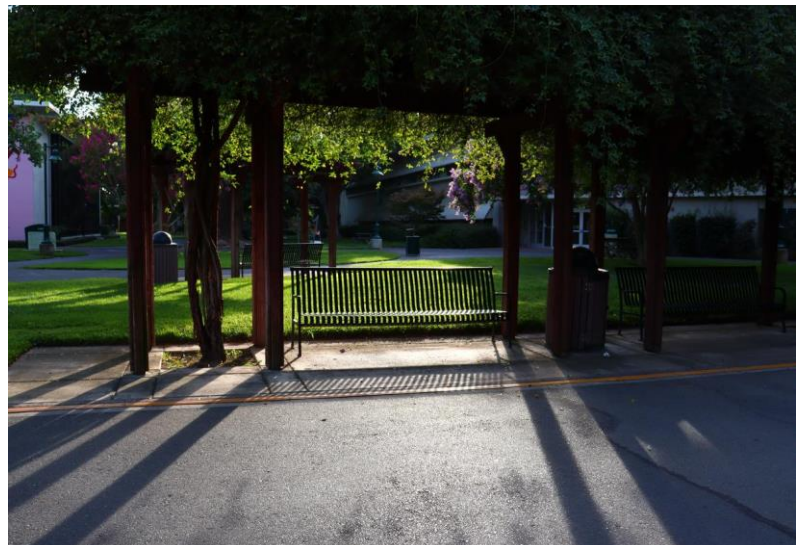

The Career Center at Sacramento State, awarded a grant, collaborates with the City of Sacramento to address economic inequity for youth in historically disenfranchised neighborhoods through the project "Increasing Sacramento Promise Zone's Youth Voice in Workforce Development and Developing Employer Capacity to Respond."

Aligned with the City's Inclusive Economic Development goals, the project advances the Youth Excel Initiative (YEI), led by the National League of Cities, aiming to enhance access to quality postsecondary education and STEM career pathways for marginalized youth.
