JUMPSTART CORPS MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

Jumpstart members make a substantial impact in the life of young children. During the school year, Corps members serve 300 hours, 8-10 hours per week by fulfilling the following responsibilities:

Essential Functions

Overall

Jumpstart Corps members will be able to:

- Verbally communicate with peers, Jumpstart staff, children, children's families and classroom teachers, both in person and over virtual settings.
- Arrange their own transportation to service site in a timely and reliable fashion for any in-person service activities.
- Use technology effectively to access systems and platforms for electronic documents, communications, trainings, and any delivery of virtual service activities.
- o Demonstrate effective writing skills in English in order to implement the Jumpstart program. This includes writing reflections and demonstrating how to write words and letters for children.
- o Demonstrating effective reading skills in English in order to implement the Jumpstart program. This includes reading lesson plans, children's books, and other materials.

In the preschool classroom

Jumpstart Corps members will be able to:

- o Interact with preschool-age children in a classroom or virtual setting Interaction includes being able to move around the classroom or virtual setting to participate in various activities with the children and families/teachers.
- Participate in classroom programming; this includes a variety of activities in a consistent routine that includes reading, small and large group activities, and facilitating other learning-based activities.
- Participate fully in each week in additional individual classroom or virtual service, implementing individualized activities with children, families, and/or supporting teacher-led activities.

Outside the preschool classroom

Jumpstart Corps members will be able to:

- o Participate fully in 15+ hours of pre-service and 35+ hours of on-going in-service trainings. These hours are included in the overall 300 hours expected of Jumpstart Corps members.
- o Participate fully in 1+ hour team planning meetings and service activity preparation 2-5 times per week, which includes planning, reflection, and/or training, for a total of 2-5 hours per week, working with other members in a small group to reflect on and plan for weekly service activities.
- o Complete 1-3 hours weekly of individual planning and preparation for Jumpstart service activities. This includes preparing children's books for readings, practicing activity facilitation and flow, gathering/creating activity materials, and assembling family/classroom learning kits and newsletters.

MARGINAL FUNCTIONS

Jumpstart Corps members will be able to:

 Attend periodic service days and events outside of regularly scheduled service, occasionally held on weekends, either in-person or virtually.

We anticipate all Jumpstart activities to be in-person but may be virtual depending on public health requirements.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Dedication to early childhood education
 - Experience working with young children, and/or a desire to learn more about early childhood education.
 - Strong language and communication skills.
 - Ability to communicate and collaborate with children's families and partner teachers.
 - o Willingness to learn about Jumpstart program implementation and planning.
 - Willingness to implement Jumpstart's research-based curriculum with integrity.

Commitment to service

- Community service experience and/ or a desire to serve in the community.
- Ability to work with people from diverse backgrounds.
- Ability to fulfill a yearlong community service commitment.
- Enthusiastic and positive attitude toward helping others.

Professionalism

- Ability to work well on a team to collaborate, communicate, and problem solve.
- o Desire to seek opportunities for self and team growth.
- Willingness to receive and provide feedback to improve quality of one's service in the program.
- Availability, dependability, and willingness to be flexible in different contexts, such as in training, scheduling, in the classroom or virtual setting with unexpected changes.
- Professionalism and good judgment in relating to Jumpstart peers, children, partners, and families.

BENEFITS

- If eligible, a \$3,000 Federal Work Study award during term of service.
- AmeriCorps members will be eligible to receive a \$1300 <u>Segal AmeriCorps Education</u> <u>Award</u> upon completion of their 300 hours service term.
- Extensive training in the field of early childhood education.
- Unique opportunity to join a national network of individuals serving young children.
- Invaluable opportunity to make a difference in the lives of young children.
