Data Management Plans

(last revised August 2021)

NSF is requiring that all proposals be accompanied by a data management plan that is detailed in a two-page (maximum) supplement to the proposal. See [NSF PAPPG Chapter II.C.2.j](#). Other agencies also require DMPs be included with submissions.

The DMP Tool <https://dmptool.org> is an online tool that can direct you to the required format of multiple funders and templates for their specific programs. If you go through the institutional log in for California State University, Sacramento, you can also see plans created by other faculty on campus and share your plan if desired.

Once you have crafted a plan, the library's Scholarly Communication Librarian (see below) is available to review and provide input if you provide sufficient time (usually 72 hours).
