

## Restarting Research at Sacramento State

### Model for Phased Approach to Restoration of Research, Scholarship and Creative Activities

#### Phase I - SCOPE OF WORK:

Is the work necessary to maintain the welfare of essential life and/or prevent damage to highly valuable property?

If YES, then the following people may engage in research and scholarship-related activities on campus:  Faculty  Staff  Students  Guests/Visitors

And their work may proceed subject to the following conditions:  Maximum of two people  Maximum of twenty hours per week on campus

1	<p><b>Situation unknown and changing State-wide Safer-at- Home Order is in place.</b></p> <p>Evidence indicates incidence and prevalence of new COVID 19 infections are on the rise (e.g., number of diagnoses, number of deaths, number of hospitalizations, other criteria yet-to-be-determined).</p> <p>Testing limited, capacity to do contact tracking limited, PPE shortages, limited access to treatment (hospital beds, ventilators, etc.).</p>	<p><b>Only activities to support research and scholarship continuity are allowed. In consultation with the Chancellor, exceptions can be made at the campus level by the President.</b></p> <p>Individuals identified as “essential” to maintaining research and scholarship capability are allowed on campus.</p> <p>All research, scholarship and creative activities that can be conducted remotely should continue in that mode.</p>	<p><b>RESEARCH, SCHOLARSHIP AND CREATIVE ACTIVITY CONTINUITY ONLY</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Requests must clearly demonstrate urgent need to access campus facilities.</li> <li>• Faculty must be able to work safely alone.</li> <li>• Time on campus must be limited.</li> <li>• No students allowed.</li> </ul>	Current
