## Child Abuse Defined

The physical or mental injury, sexual abuse or exploitation, negligent treatment, or maltreatment of a child under the <u>age of 18</u> by a person who is <u>responsible for the child's welfare</u> under circumstances which indicate that the child's <u>health or welfare</u> is harmed or threatened.

Child Welfare Act

### Neglect

Failure of parents or caretakers to provide needed, age appropriate care including food, clothing, shelter, protection from harm, and supervision appropriate to the child's development, hygiene, and medical care.


### Physical Abuse

Any <u>non-accidental</u> injury to a child under the age of 18 by a parent or caretaker. These injuries may include beatings, shaking, burns, human bites, strangulation, or immersion in scaling water or other, with resulting bruises and welts, fractures, scars, burns, internal injuries or any other injury

### Sexual Abuse

Any inappropriate sexual exposure or touch by an <u>adult to a child</u> or an <u>older child to a</u> <u>younger child</u>. This includes, but is not limited to fondling, sexual intercourse, sexual assault, rape, incest, child prostitution, exposure, and pornography. It does not matter whether the victim was forced or tricked to any of the above. Regardless it is considered sexual abuse.



### **Emotional Abuse**

Parental behavior, such as rejecting, terrorizing, berating, ignoring, or isolating a child, that causes or is likely to cause, serious impairment of the physical, social, mental, or emotional capacities of the child.






# Reporting Child Abuse

 A mandated reporter is required to report child abuse if she or he in their professional capacity, or within the scope of his or her employment has knowledge of, or observes a child whom the mandated reporter knows or *reasonably suspects* has been the victim of child abuse or neglect (P.C. 1166[a], emphasis added)
