



5. Now go back to the Library database page, and look at the Biology databases. Choose PubMed. Perform the same search in PubMed, and find a minimum of three new sources. Click on one reference, and find one new article in the “related links” box. E-mail the results to yourself (find instructions in the FAQs – see menu on left side of screen). Then **forward that email to me with the subject line Geology 105 database2.**
6. Take one author from your reference list, and run a search on Google to find a publications list for that person. Find a minimum of one new reference this way. **Write the full citation here.**
7. Here’s a way to update older sources. Choose your oldest reference. Enter the title of the paper into Google Scholar (scholar.google.com). Find the paper in your search results. Look for the “Cited by” link and click on it. These are papers that cited your paper. Find one paper that looks useful, and **write the full citation here.**
8. **Turn in this paper with #1, 2, 3, 6 & 7 completed.**
