

Before You Get Started

- 1. Only Faculty and Staff should need to map to campus network drives. Students: we recommend using OneDrive for personal file storage.
- 2. Make sure you have an Internet connection.

ON CAMPUS: Use eduroam


OFF-CAMPUS: (not connected via eduroam), use the <u>Global Protect VPN</u> application to connect to campus networks.

Mapping a Drive in Mac OSX

- 1. Open a Finder window.
- 2. Select the **Go** menu, then click **Connect to Server**.



3. A **Connect to Server** window will appear.



4. Map to the following drives as needed:

Departmental Drive: "N:" Drive Folder Path: smb://sacfiles1.saclink.csus.edu/shared

Project Folders: "P:" Drive Folder Path: smb://sacfiles1.saclink.csus.edu/project

Personal Folders: Folder Path: smb://sacfiles1.saclink.csus.edu/home/x/xxxx

('x' is the folder in your path and 'xxxx' is your username)

Tip: Unsure what your folder path is to your personal drive? Visit

<u>mysaclink.csus.edu</u> and enter the required information.

- 5. Enter your folder location into the **Server Address** field.
- 6. Click the + button if you would like to save this drive.
- 7. Click **Connect**.
- 8. Enter your SacLink username and password, then click **OK**.
- 9. The requested drive will appear in the left column of your Finder window under the **Shared** section.

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
