Amount: Varies (multiple awards)

Open to: This scholarship is open to Sac State full-time undergraduate and graduate degree seeking students
2.75 GPA or higher
Accepted to a study abroad program

Amount: Varies (multiple awards)

Amount: Up to \$5,000 + \$3,000 critical language supplement (multiple awards)

Awards of up to \$5,000 to support U.S. citizen undergraduates receiving federal Pell Grant funding at a 2 year or 4 year undergraduate colleges or universities in study abroad. Students studying a Critical Need Language may receive a \$3,000 supplement for at total possible award of \$8,000. This program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

Open to: Undergraduate students
US Citizen
Accepted to or have applied to a study abroad program at least 3 weeks long
Pell Grant recipient

Deadline: March (fall) & October (spring)

Amount: \$1,200 - 10,000

Fund for Education Abroad (FEA) provides scholarships and ongoing support to students who are underrepresented among the US study abroad population. FEA makes life-changing, international experiences accessible to all by supporting minority, community college, and first-generation college students before, during, and after they participate in education abroad programs.

Open to: U.S. citizen or permanent resident
Currently enrolled as an undergraduate at a college or university in the U.S. (graduate students are not eligible)
Study abroad program must be eligible for credit at the student's home institution
Study abroad program must be at least 4 weeks (28 days) in country/countries

Deadline: January (summer and fall), August (spring)

[Phi Kappa Phi Study Abroad Grants](#)

Amount: \$1,000

Phi Kappa Phi Study Abroad Grants are designed to help support undergraduates as they seek knowledge and experience in their academic fields by studying abroad. Fifty \$1,000 grants are awarded each year. **Open to:** Sophomores or Juniors with a 3.75 or higher GPA who are attending an institution with a Phi Kappa Phi chapter.

Deadline: March (all)

NSEP Boren Scholarship

Amount: Up to \$20,000

Boren Scholarships provide up to \$20,000 to U.S. undergraduate students to study abroad in areas of the world that are critical to U.S. interests and underrepresented in study abroad, including Africa, Asia, Central & Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America, and the Middle East.

Deadline: January (all)

U.S. Fulbright Student Program

Amount: Varies

Established in 1946, the Fulbright Program aims to increase mutual understanding between the peoples of the United States and other countries, through the exchange of persons, knowledge, and skills. **Open to:** U.S. citizens who are graduating seniors; hold a B.S./B.A. degree; are a master's or doctoral degree candidate; or are a young professional or artist, and are thinking of studying, teaching or conducting research abroad.

Deadline: October (all)

Freeman-Asia: Awards for Study in Asia

Amount: Up to \$7,000

The primary goal of the Freeman Awards for Study in Asia is to increase the number of U.S. undergraduates who study abroad in East and Southeast Asia.

Open to: Undergraduate students, US Citizen, Accepted to or have applied to a study abroad program in Asia at least 8 weeks long

Financial needs as demonstrated through FAFSA, Little to no experience in the country applying to

Deadline: April

Hosteling International Explore the World Travel Scholarship

Amount: \$2,000
