Sacramento Mutual Aid Resources

Due to the federal government shut down, many people, benefiting from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), are faced with uncertainty about their ability to have food and resources for themselves and their families. Federal workers are navigating life without their income and facing job insecurity.

This crisis is one that can be addressed in community. Via the mutual aid concept. A mutual aid society is a group of people who voluntarily cooperate to support each other, often by pooling resources to help members in need due to illness, unemployment, or other crises. Unlike charity, which is often conditional, mutual aid is based on principles of solidarity and horizontal, community-led organization, where everyone gives and receives help as needed.
