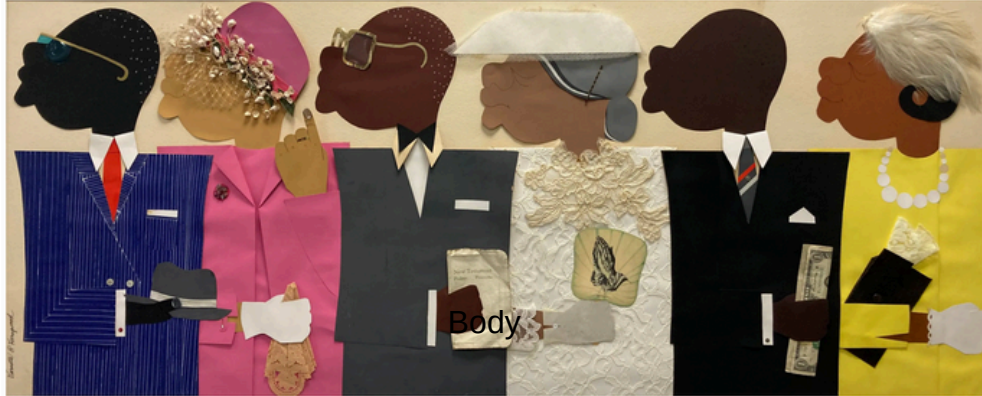

The Crocker Art Museum is pleased to announce Black Artists in America: From the Bicentennial to September 11, on view from October 5, 2025, through January 11, 2026.

Black Artists in America focuses on the transitional moment from the late 1970s to the dawn of the 21st century, featuring more than 50 artworks by such artists as Jean-Michel Basquiat, Romare Bearden, Camille Billops, Elizabeth Catlett, Barkley L. Hendricks, Varnette Honeywood, Lois Mailou Jones, Jacob Lawrence, Whitfield Lovell, and Howardena Pindell.

The exhibition picks up where the Dixon Gallery and Gardens's 2023 exhibition *Black Artists in America: From Civil Rights to the Bicentennial* (on view at the Crocker in early 2024) left off, the second in a three-part series.
