4. Outcomes from Angela and Ti:

Comp 2 specifications came from working group of Area A2, based on precedent of other campuses. The first line under specifications also was a GE committee recommendation. Explicitly, these must be stated. Specifications reflect assessment, which is best proactice as relected in current evidence. Those present recommend that the entire committee review the COMP II Learning Outcomes and we will vote on them at our next meeting, November 29, 2017. Committee tanks Ti and Angela for this good work.

5. Hogan will lead this discussion regarding the review of the referral from the Executive Committee regarding the English/Writing Requirement. Please ensure that your parent committee, the General Education/Graduation Requirements Policy Committee, has reviewed and approved your recommendations before forwarding them to the Senate Chair.(see attached memo)

We understand that the GWAR policy needs to be updated. During our review of the written policy we noted several other out of date and erroneous policy language and information. As a group we aim to craft a recommendation for addressing the out of date language and information, as requested.
