- Student Survey/Focus Group:
 - Latest number of the response is 250 students completed survey and last Friday
 18 students participated in a focus group
 - Point of Data Saturation
 - Students are mainly looking for:
 - Case management and counseling
 - Social Gathering
 - Safe Space and Support
 - Tutoring and mentoring
 - Professional Mentorship
 - What students hope APIDA center will look like:
 - 41% quiet study area
 - 29% computer room
 - 28% hangout area
