Goals

- Gain leadership skills through the Leadership Initiative and promote campus involvement
- Connect students to campus resources

- Pre-enrollment in 12 -15 units in first semester in college/strategic schedule
- Strategies of how to be successful in first year of college
- Mentorship through peer support
- Instruction and classroom support
- Class planning
- One-on-one advising with peer mentor, counselor, and or advisor
- Assistance with campus leadership certificate completion

Advising Requirements

Students are required to meet with their Instructional Student Assistant (ISA) in the fall one time during the semester. In the spring the EOP counseling staff will provide GE counseling to the Ethnic Studies 98 course to meet the student's EOP advising requirement.
