## **Students' Transitions & How You Can Help**

- Expect students to feel confused about virtual, hybrid and in-person course offerings.
- Remind students of the basics:
  - Buy the books. Do the reading.
  - Go to class. Do the homework.
- Encourage students to find ways to be involved:
  - Ex: Join a club
- Encourage self-advocacy and persistence.
- Remind students to establish a relationship with faculty.
- Participate in class.
- Help students navigate the university.
- Remind students about campus resources.
- Encourage students to think outside the box.
- Offer communication tips.
- Listen.

- Required for students: DUO mobile app for security/authentication
- Take the Hornet Online Learning course in Canvas to learn to use Canvas.
- Remind students to check MySacState, their Student Center, and their Sac State email.
