Despite numbers and success, female students will be underpaid and enter feminized (lower-paying) professions


3. Campus Safety Convo at Sac State:



Undergrad and Grad Students by Gender





Student Health & Counseling

Academic Year 2023-2024 in progress (7/1/2023 through 3/18/2024)

Total Counseling Visits: 5,401

- Female: 3,782
 - O 70% of visits
- Male: 1,566
- Nonbinary: 53



Total Medical Visits: 11,026

- Female: 7,768
 - O 70% of visits
- Male: 3,202
- Nonbinary: 56


Student Organizations & Leadership

Clubs and Sport Clubs

- 283 Total Clubs
 - 39 (or 14%) have a mission around serving female-identified groups
- 16 Sport Clubs
 - 4 (or 25%) are female-majority sport clubs
 - Softball, Women's Rugby, Women's Soccer, Volleyball
 - Cheer and Dance clubs coming soon
 - 7 (or 43%) other clubs have at least one female
 - Bass fishing, Esports, Cycling, Rock Climbing, Rowing, Ski & Snow Team, Tennis, Wrestling

Greek Life (sororities and fraternities)

- 35 total organizations
 - 22 (or 63%) are sororities (femalefocused)
- 788 students in Greek life
 467 (or 65%) are female





Student Athletes

2023-2024



- 19 NCAA collegiate athletic teams
 - 11 women's teams
 - O 8 men's teams
- 459 student athletes
 - 208 (or 45%) women
 - O 251 (or 55%) men
- Average Student Athlete GPA: 3.22
 - Women's average GPA: 3.37
 - Women's Volleyball team avg: 3.64
 - Men's average GPA: 3.09

How do female-identified students feel?

Satisfied or Extremely Satisfied

- <u>Respect</u> for women and gender identity overall at Sac State (74% of respondents)
- <u>Fair classroom environment</u> and inclusion for female-identified students (78% of respondents)
- Classes acknowledge contributions from diverse sources (70% of respondents)
- <u>Curriculum includes women</u> (80% of respondents)
- Campus policies and efforts regarding sexual assault and sexual harrassment prevention (52% of respondents)
- Representation of women in leadership (52% of respondents)

Dissatisfied or Extremely Dissatisfied

- Safety on campus (15% feel unsafe during the day)
- Safety on campus at night (78% feel unsafe at night)
 - 43% said campus needs more lighting
 - 10% said they feel unsafe in parking structures
- Awareness of <u>OB-GYN check-ups</u> at the WELL (89% of respondents were unaware of this service)
- Awareness of <u>birth control options</u> at the WELL (41% of respondents were unaware of this service)
- Awareness of <u>free pregnancy tests</u> at the WELL and/or in the WRC (48% unaware of this service)
