Who we are

Sophomore Bridge is a program designed to aid EOP students as they continue to transition into their second academic year.

Summer 2019 Demographics

Gender

66% of them are female.

34% of them are male.

Ethnicity

64% of them are Hispanic/Latino.

23% of them are Asian/Pacific Islander.

5% of them are Black/African American.

4% of them are categorized as Other.

3% of them are White.

1% of them are Native American.

Performance Indicators

99% of the 2019 Summer Bridge students are enrolled full-time for fall 2019.

71% of the students are taking 15 units or more.

The average unit load is 14.79.

Survey

91% of students indicated they were challenged intellectually during their summer English 20 course.

95% of students agreed that the program was a good way to interact with fellow peers and build community.

96% of students rated the sophomore bridge experience positively.

Outcomes

Year 2015

1. Number of Participants was 18.
2. 100% of Sophomore Bridge students reached Junior Status after their 2nd year compared to 89% for Non-Sophomore Bridge students.
3. 89% of Sophomore Bridge students reached Senior Status after their 3rd year compared to 56% for Non-Sophomore Bridge students.

Year 2016

1. Number of Participants was 56.
2. 96% of Sophomore Bridge students reached Junior Status after their 2nd year compared to 91% for Non-Sophomore Bridge students.
3. 80% of Sophomore Bridge students reached Senior Status after their 3rd year compared to 61% for Non-Sophomore Bridge students.

Year 2017

1. Number of Participants was 79.
2. 96% of Sophomore Bridge students reached Junior Status after their 2nd year compared to 72% for Non-Sophomore Bridge students.
3. 71% of Sophomore Bridge students reached Senior Status after their 3rd year compared to 58% for Non-Sophomore Bridge students.

Year 2018

1. Number of Participants was 64.
2. 78% of Sophomore Bridge students reached Junior Status after their 2nd year compared to 73% for Non-Sophomore Bridge students.

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
