  - a. Goals

    - ii. Bridge the cultural gap between Spanish-speaking parents and California's educational system
    - iii. Provide information and resources (in Spanish and English) from preschool to higher education aimed at increasing the college-going culture among the Latinx population
    - iv. Provide a variety of career paths and alternatives in a diverse range of fields
