Who we are

Services to Students with Disabilities offers a wide range of support services and accommodations for students with disabilities to have equal access and opportunity to pursue their educational goals.

Demographics of Students for Fall 2019/Spring 2020 (N=957)

Gender

60% of them are female.

40% of them are male.

Ethnicity

40% of them are White.

22% of them are Hispanic/Latinx.

14% of them are Other.

11% of them are Black/African American.

10% of them are Asian.

2% of them are Native American.

1% of them are Pacific Islander.

Class Level

9% were freshmen.

Key Performance Indicators

Fall 2018 (N=873)

Average Term GPA was 3.00.

Average Unit Load was 13.64.

79% of students were full-time.

35% of students were enrolled with 15 units or more.

94% of students were in good academic standing.

100% of students persisted the following semester.

Spring 2019 (N=955)

Average Unit Load was 11.88.

72% of students were full-time.

27% of students were enrolled with 15 units or more.

Services

1. **TRIO Student Support Services Program** - Federally funded outreach and service program for students with disabilities from low-income backgrounds.
 - a. 2018-2019 Results
 - i. 88% of TRIO students persisted in the fall term of the next academic year or graduated with a bachelor's degree during the reporting year.
 - ii. 96% of TRIO students who met the performance level required to stay in good academic standing.
 - iii. 94% of TRIO students from cohort year 2013-2014 graduated with a bachelor's degree within six reporting years.
2. **Access Accommodations** – Services may include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. assistance regarding the admission process
 - b. academic advising/course selection assistance referrals
 - c. career development and guidance referrals
 - d. counseling: academic, personal or vocational
 - e. financial aid advising/scholarship information referrals
 - f. housing assistance and information
 - g. registration assistance
 - h. tutoring information referrals
3. **Testing Accommodations** – In partnership with the Testing Center, SSWD students are provided with auxiliary aids such as readers, scribes, and/or appropriate assistive technology.
4. **Assistive Technology Lab (ATL)** – Accessible computer technology that would best meet the needs of the individual student with print disabilities to further academic success.

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
