College Futures Foundation Report Update (12/14/2020)

Counselor Conference

During the academic year 2019-2020, Admissions and Outreach organized four Counselor Conferences on 10/2/19, 11/6/19, 2/12/20 and 3/4/20. More than 375 counselors and administrators from elementary, middle, and high schools, as well as community colleges, and community organizations attended the conferences.

- 94% of attendees said the workshops offered were informative.
- 79% of attendees felt more informed about ADTs.
- 87% of attendees understood how ADTs support timely graduation.
- 79% of attendees felt more prepared/empowered to discuss ADTs with their students.
- 97% of attendees agreed that Sacramento State should continue to offer this event.

Outreach

More than 1,600 potential transfer students visited the Admissions and Outreach's Transfer Center with 5,500 potential transfer students.

- Transfer Center Visits: 22 schools
- Community College Presentations: 374 attendees
- Transfer Day: 5571 attendees

Transfer Peer Coaches

TPCs attended 70 events during Fall 2019 including American River College Outreach, Cosumnes River College Outreach, San Joaquin Delta College Outreach and Feria de Educacion. TPCs interacted with more than 1,000 potential transfer students. In addition, they attended 33 events during Spring 2020. They interacted with 309 potential transfer students from different community colleges including Sacramento City, Solano, American River, Woodland, Yuba and Folsom Lake.

TPCs Prospective Students Interactions

- 315 in Fall 2018 to 1063 in Fall 2019
- 220 in Spring 2019 to 309 in Spring 2020
- In Spring 2020, TPCs had limited face-to-face interactions and outreach events due to COVID-19.
