What We Do

The Native Scholars & Transition Program aims to increase the enrollment, retention and graduation rates of Native students. The program guides students through the admissions process, and provides transitional support through summer programming, and learning communities.

Student Enrollment

Fall 2019 (N=78)

46 students were female.

32 students were male.

10% were freshmen.

4% were sophomores.

24% were juniors.

37% were seniors.

23% were graduates.

1% were other.

Spring 2020 (N=77)

43 students were female.

34 students were male.

7% were freshmen.

4% were sophomores.

27% were juniors.

40% were seniors.

18% were graduates.

3% were other.
