Who We Are

PERSIST is designed to meet the needs of students who are in their second-year of college at Sacramento State. It provides a series of workshops including academic planning, wellness, financial aid and workforce skills development for students to make a smooth transition to their upper division course material.

How We Help Students

- Enroll students in 15 units or more in the following semester
- Provide students with financial aid and FAFSA information
- Help students understand University's academic requirements, policies and procedures
- Collaborate with community members and bring workforce skill workshops to students
- Get students involved in campus activities
- Disability testing for a limited number of eligible students
- In conjunction with The Well, provide Active Minds Stress Less, Worry Less workshop presentations
- Get students connected to campus resources and mentoring opportunities

Workshops Offered

- 1. Financial Aid: "What's Next?"
- 2. Career Readiness: Teamwork/Collaboration
- 3. Health and Wellness: Active Minds Stress Less, Worry Less
- 4. Progress to Degree: Academic Advising/Class Planning

Results from English 20 Presentations (N=192)

- Nine English 20 Presentation during Fall 2020
- 72% of students felt prepared for the following semester as a result of the PERSIST presentation.
- 99% of students felt that the workshop was helpful.
- Challenges/Barriers Experience as a Sophomore
 - o 40% Time-Management
 - 33% Advising for Major/Advising
 - 16% Difficult Classes
 - o 7% Mental Health
 - 4% Financial Difficulty
- Additional Services Students want to Receive
 - o 39% Resources on Campus (PARC, Writing Center, Counseling)
 - o 32% Academic Advising for Specific Major
 - o 17% Financial Aid
 - o 12% Career/Internship
