Facts about Housing

- 2100+ students living on campus
- The Served @ the Dining Commons feeds over 4,000 students weekly (non-COVID).
- UHS works with the ASI Green Team and campus partners on composting and other green initiatives.
- The American River Courtyard was the first LEED certified building on campus.
- The COP Program (Community Oriented Policing) is located in Riverview Hall and includes a full-time officer and Service Officers.
- Housing and food costs range anywhere between \$9,700 & \$14,300 per year.

Graduation Rates

1. First-time freshman students (cohort fall 2015) who live on-campus graduated at a higher rate (27.4%) compared to first-time freshman students who lived off-campus at 16.2%.

2. First-time freshman students (cohort fall 2016) who live on-campus graduated at a higher rate (23.7%) compared to first-time freshman students who lived off-campus at 14.8%.
3. Transfer students (cohort fall 2017) who live on-campus graduated at a higher rate (48.5%) compared to transfer students who lived off-campus at 42.7%.
4. Transfer students (cohort fall 2018) who live on-campus graduated at a higher rate (40%) compared to transfer students who lived off-campus at 37.9%.
