Who We Are

Full Circle Project is an Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander – Serving Institution (AANAPISI) funded program that aims to assist these students throughout their entire college careers, and provide ample opportunities to engage in service both on and off campus to enhance their university experience.

Gender

68% of them are female.
32% of them are male.

Age

Average age was 18.4 years old.
Age ranged from 17 to 23 years old.

Class Level

95% were freshmen.
5% were sophomores.

Key Performance Indicators

Fall 2020 (n=96)

Average Term GPA was 3.04.
Average Unit Load was 16.75.
99% of students were full-time.
90% of students were enrolled with 15 units or more.
88% of students were in good academic standing.
100% was the retention rate the following semester.

Spring 2021 (n=96)

Average Term GPA was 2.93.
Average Unit Load was 14.84.
97% of students were full-time.
74% of students were enrolled with 15 units or more.

92% of students were in good academic standing.
