Pregnant Students

- We began serving **pregnant students** in 2021 to assist students with academic continuity after they give birth and return to classes.
- 13 pregnant students served

Student-Parents

 - Larger than all students in the College of Business (undergrad and grad combined)
 - 641 student-parents engaged with us live via Zoom

Hornet Family Study Care Program: Childcare Vouchers

Federal funding used to pay for on-campus childcare or to provide childcare vouchers

- During hours of CCAMPIS provided child care, CCAMPIS student-parents were able to
 - Attend class
 - Take earlier classes
 - Take later classes
 - Have additional study time
 - Obtain tutoring assistance
 - Obtain advising or counseling support
 - Spend more time in the library/computer lab
 - Participate in group study projects or meetings
- 46 student-parents served
- 57 children participants

PARENTS & FAMILIES OF SAC STATE STUDENTS

- 11,958 parents and family members of students subscribe to our e-newsletter.
 - 1,474 parents and family members of Sac State students engaged with us live via Zoom in AY20-21
- Top 5 questions as students transition to Sacramento State are:
 - Paying for college Financial Aid, dates and deadlines, logistics
 - o Getting to campus and being on campus Housing, parking, food
 - Support services for students (social opportunities, emotional support, physical and mental wellness, safety, personal wellbeing, disability services)
 - How to navigate the university system (how parents pay fees online, how students schedule appointments, what systems students need to know such as Canvas, what is the student center and how and why do students access it, etc.)
 - How Academics work academic advising, tutoring, course sequencing, choosing/changing major, connection with faculty, online instruction
